PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Our focus for the remainder of the year is to continue to glorify God with our behaviour and academics. With your help, our students have met the challenge of raised expectations of uniform and behaviour in Term 3 after an eventful first semester. We have introduced Peacewise for kids across the entire school this term. Peacewise a Christian program of conflict resolution that gives students the skill and language of conflict resolution. You may hear some of the language being used at home; see the Year 2 describing this more. We are also beginning work with consultants on improving our positive behaviour for learning practices, with a committee being formed to implement character building as the focus of correcting behaviour.

Our staff are committed to glorifying God in their own life and in the lives of your children. To improve our practice, we have been studying a book called Transformation by Design, which is a framework for designing curricular activities aligned to our biblical ethos. We do this work in partnership with our 12 other CCM school, dedicating the first part of our weekly staff meetings to professional learning. Our staff also meet in small learning teams of 3-4 on Monday mornings for devotions and Thursday afternoons to look at evidence of student learning and how to better meet their needs.

We are grateful to have been gifted 20 mountain bikes and a trailer from Nepean Christian School. In exchange, we will share our Kayaks and gear with them. Our students are looking forward to learning bike maintenance skills as well as exploring God's creation in a safe yet exhilarating manner. We look forward to further expanding our outdoor program as we discover God's eternal power and divine nature from what has been made. Rom 1:20

We are also grateful for the tremendous efforts of our 2020 Captains, Tyler McCabe and Taila Ward. They both worked tremendously hard to make our school year enjoyable despite the challenges. We anticipate a proper yr 12 formal in Term 4, with more details to come. Our SRC has begun the preparations to elect new school Captains, which we will announce on Wed, 9 Sept. As we look to opening our campus further for events in Term 4, we will have an induction ceremony inviting parents and community.

Mathematics News

Where every student counts!

More students can now choose to take higher levels of Mathematics since the new curriculum was introduced. During the HSC examinations there will be a common paper for both Mathematics Advanced and Mathematics Standard 2. Some year 10 students have indicated their interest in taking Mathematics Extension 1 with Mathematics Advanced next year. I am looking forward to exploring the new topics with them in this exciting course.

During the first week of Term 3 we completed the Smart Start financial literacy program for years 7 to 12. Earning, Spending, Investing, Saving and Enterprise were the smart topics covered. Most students went home inspired and are now skilled enough to know whether they are paid fairly at work.

Presently Year 7 are learning about Perimeter and Area and are using their knowledge to design stained glass windows. Year 8 are finishing off Coordinate Geometry and are able to plot points on a number plane. Year 9 are learning about Similar Figures and are able to enlarge and reduce images using the scale factor. Year 10 are proving Congruent Figures and learning how to set out formal proofs. Year 11 Mathematics Advanced are working on Trigonometrical Functions and year 11 Mathematics Standard 2 are doing Statistical Analysis. Year 12 completed their Mathematics Trial Examinations on Thursday and will start to revise and practise past papers to build speed and fluency for the HSC examination later this year.
